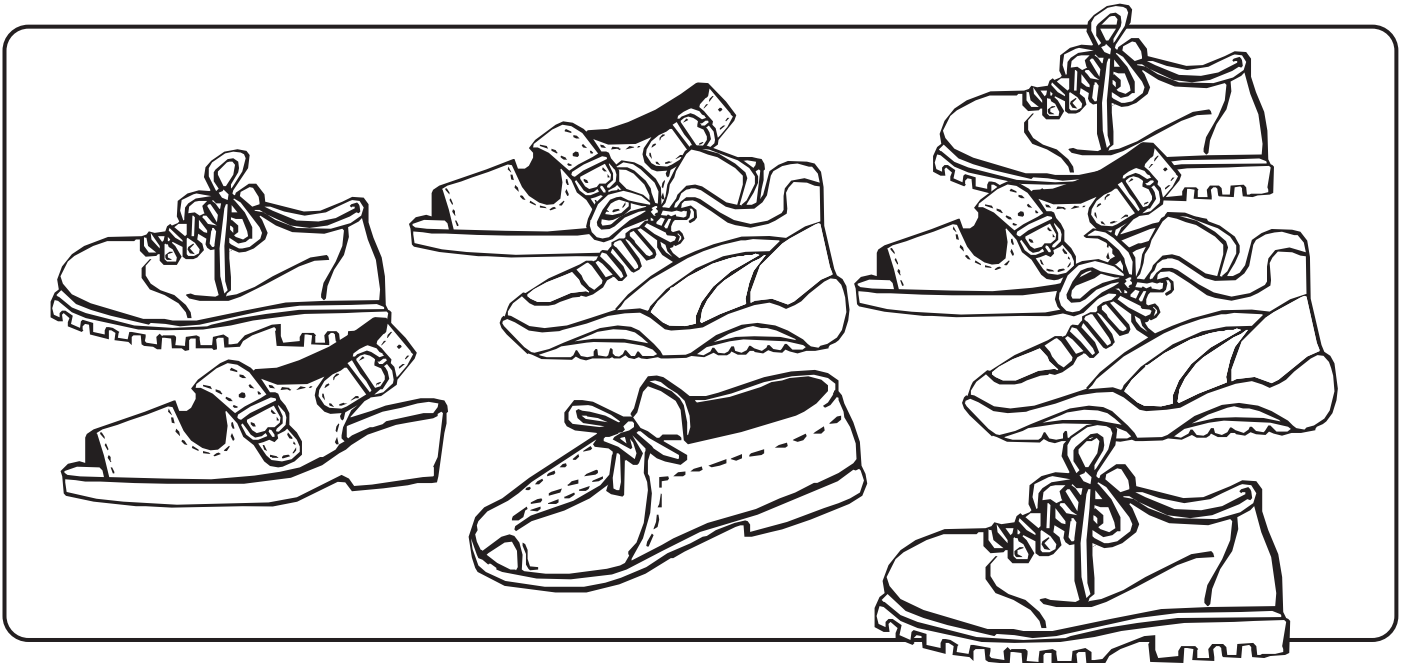


1, 2 *Pick a Shoe!*

Here's a two-person game to teach you a Bible verse about helping someone.

1. Set up some shoes in four rows: two shoes in the first row, three shoes in the next row and four shoes in the third row.



2. Both players must play the entire game while standing on one foot.
3. One person starts the game by removing a shoe or shoes from one of the rows and putting it aside. Any number of shoes can be removed by one person during his turn but only from one row.
4. Take turns removing shoes until only one shoe is left. (Make sure you're still standing on one foot!)
5. The player who removes the very last shoe must quote Ecclesiastes 8:9-10 ("Two are better than one . . . : If one falls down, his friend can help him up.") If he can say the verse, you both win the game. If he forgets to say the verse or messes up, the other player can help him. But if neither of you can say it you both have to stay on one foot and start the game all over until someone learns the verse and helps the other out!
